We moved to the more somber Broken Wand ceremony for Gil Stubbs, attended by his family members over Zoom. They shared stories about his "Gil Stubbs' World of Magic" public access television show; his prolific magic notes and write-ups; his passionate opinions on topics from parking to politics; his magic charity shows and volunteer community events; and his contribution to the Apollo 11 Program (which I looked up—he contributed [the Pitch-Yaw Autopilot of the Command and Service Module), along with Bob Filene, albeit in a different department! Here is a link to an interview with his son-in-law on the Apollo program.

Their stories all painted a picture of Gil's passion for magic, charitable nature, and love of teaching others to enjoy magic as well. Although this does have its limits—Susan Brunner told the story of how Gil's son snuck the neighborhood kids into Gil's magic treasure trove in a bid to improve his popularity by revealing the tricks, like a middle school masked magician! Truly Gil would have set them on the path towards wizardry had they just asked or attended one of the many teach-ins he hosted. The ones at the school were standing room

only, and magically turned classes that could not attend green with envy.

Many lives, from Earth to the Moon, were made richer by knowing Gil. Through his generosity and mentorship, his magic will live on in those he taught.

In that spirit, we proceeded to our Money Magic informal teach-in.

Pat Farenga led us off with a melting coin routine that was certainly eye catching. The inspiration comes from "Closeup Magic" by Bob King with some added heat.

Dan Bybell showed off how to squeeze 50% interest out of a dollar bill. A combination of a "Money Makes Money" from *Karl Fulves' Self Working Coin Magic* with some added subtlety by Alan Wassilak. Now if he could just scale up production, we could be onto something...

Dan ended with a cautionary tale of why you don't steal another magician's thunder. They still don't know how the coin trick is done as a result.

Recently added member Michael Charles floored the group with a 4 coin routine with a special kicker to Double dot the I's and Cross the T's.

David Penn performed a pair of tricks, starting with a lucky number 13 dollar trick. Or was it unlucky? In any case, it gets straightened out in the end. This is based on an effect Mikey Lee often performs with 5 dollar bills (*Linking Ring October* 2019). He followed with coin effect from Bobo where an envelope is destroyed, taking the coin with it.



President's Report




Learning Magic
